Following a Historic Assessment Report prepared by RPA & Associates, LLC, dated November 21, 2023, and recommendations following the Geneva Historic Preservation Commission Policy Guide for Window Repair or Replacement Requests, a total of eight windows are to be rehabilitated which are concentrated around the north and east entrances and are integral to the character of the historic structure as well as the most prominent windows to those visiting the building.
